We are exceptionally grateful for your support over this last year and for everyone sticking with us throughout the pandemic.

Apart from a few weeks during the state lockdown, **we managed to keep our facility open for our participants and families.** We adapted, set up health and safety protocols and made it possible for countless parents, caregivers and family members to continue to work, knowing their loved ones were in a safe environment with activities to do, and most importantly, access to their network of friends and social routines. Although our group outings, special events and trips were postponed, **we have continued to provide over 105 activities per week**, including recreational and fitness activities, performing arts and holiday celebrations.



An overall reduction in **attendance and a loss of rental income did impact our usual annual revenues**, but we were blessed to receive funding from many individuals, foundations and organizations who have helped to keep us afloat. **Trips and some outings are now resuming and we hope gradually to re-instate our other outings, special events and volunteer programs.** We've also used this time to update our facility and our equipment. We are moving forward into the future with renewed optimism and hope that those of you who have not yet returned will come back soon to the ARCH family. Initially 60% of our activities had to be restructured.	105 activities a week are still being delivered. Some trips and outings are now resuming.
ARCHKids program remained open. Our Paradise Valley satellite program was closed due to venue closure and those participants were transported daily to our main campus.	ARCHKids program remains ongoing. Our Paradise Valley Summer Camp resumes in June.
30 groups who used our gym and field cancelled overnight.	15 groups have now returned and we can rely on their rental income.



Energy Efficiency Project

In 2018, we initiated a funding campaign to renovate our facility and make it more energy efficient. With the generous help of individual donors and 4 local funders (City of Phoenix Neighborhood Services, Del E. Webb Foundation, Nina Mason Pulliam Charitable Trust, and the Kemper and Ethel Marley Foundation) in 2020 this project finally got underway. Although we experienced some delays, we updated 11 HVAC units, and replaced 60 lights and 17 doors. This will make the building more comfortable for everyone and over time decrease our utility costs. We are now starting Phase II which includes a new roof, restrooms and kitchen. Watch this space for more developments!

Thank You! New Hope & New Beginnings!

The grants and funding scene changed significantly during the pandemic as many funders postponed their annual grant cycles or ran out of money. Many however, came to the rescue and continued to support us throughout this challenging time. *We were particularly grateful to those who assisted us in buying new equipment so that we can come out of this time with not only renewed hope, but new supplies!* Cabela's Bass Pro Outdoor Fund helped us replace much of our camping equipment, Arizona Sports and Tourism Authority paid for Special Olympics sports uniforms and equipment and the Molly Lawson Foundation helped us update our lighting and sound equipment for our Performing Arts program. We were lucky to also receive additional COVID relief funding from the US government, the State Governor's Office, the Department for Developmental Disabilities, and other special funds set up by the Arizona Community Foundation.
