In dedication to the ARCH Founder, Mary P. Lees

Mary was born in PA in 1928, where she later became a wife and mother of five. In 1957, her fourth child Toby, was born with Down Syndrome. Due to health concerns, the family relocated to Phoenix, AZ in 1962.

At the time, few services existed for individuals with special needs. Rather than place her in an institution, Mary joined other parents to start a volunteer-led school, endorsed by the ARC.

Toby was the inspiration behind ARCH and the driving force behind Mary's lifelong dedication to advocating for individuals with special needs. Tragically, Toby passed away at age 7 in 1964 but, Mary continued her mission to improve the lives of others like her.

Mary believed in equality for those with special needs and worked tirelessly to ensure they had opportunities to grow, learn, and thrive. She passed away in 1990, leaving a lasting legacy.



We opened our doors on September 23, 1975, to 25 teens and adults in an old cafetorium at the abandoned Alhambra Elementary School on Grand Avenue.
